

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RON



Throughout Lent, the season leading up to Easter, we reflected on the worship series Altered by the Holy Spirit. We saw how the Spirit Alters our lives and how the Spirit is alive in, with, and under our ordinary lives, always calling us forward into transformation, nudging us into wholeness, and beckoning us forth into an alternative way of living.

We were challenged to do a little critical thinking about our faith. And then to put that reflection in prayer and in action as we symbolically drew on Lego-style blocks, forming our Altered Mosaic Cross. I want to invite you to watch the services which are available on our website. Here is a brief synopsis of each service.

Altered through God's Creativity

God had a great imagination when creating us, creating us all uniquely different, with different gifts and things about us that make us special and different.

* Take a brick and write one word or draw one thing on it that makes you unique, and reminds you of God's creativity when creating you!

Altered on the Edge of Belonging

Philip listened to the Spirit's urging to go to a road and then to go up to a man he never met riding in a chariot. Without Philip to explain what he was reading in the Isaiah scroll, the Ethiopian would never have understood it or learned about Jesus.

- * Take a brick and write the first name of someone who helps you.
- * Who is someone God might be calling you to help? Who is struggling with belonging? Put their initial on a brick, and place it on the cross, saying a prayer that you can help find ways to reach out and help them belong.

Altered alongside our enemies

Both Saul and Ananias are transformed or changed by the Spirit's work. God's action in this story transforms and changes who they are.

 Color a brick, transforming or changing it from one color to another, to represent the way we can be transformed or "changed" through God's work in our lives.

Altered by disruption

Peter and Cornelius—and their respective communities of Jews and Gentiles—were separated by religion, cultural and ethnic backgrounds, economics, and politics. There was much that divided them and created a great cultural chasm between their two worlds. And yet they were brought together by their faith in the One true God. Cornelius and Peter each received a vision of what God was calling them to do.

What vision is emerging of what God is calling you to do? What is the vision that God is calling us to do as a congregation? Put that vision in a word or two, and write it on a brick.

Altered through stories We Don't Trust

When Peter knocked on the door, Rhoda was overjoyed—so overjoyed, that she forgot to open the door! But when she told others who was at the door they didn't believe her, they didn't believe that their prayers were answered. Think about the stories around us. The stories we trust and those we don't. Consider how the lack of trust constrains us from seeing the possibilities of God's grace because we have chosen to listen to some stories and not others.

 Take a brick and write the initials of a person whose voice you trust, saying a prayer thanking God for their presence in your life and place it on our cross.

Victory Altered

We use two words to describe the evens of Palm Sunday, Hosanna and Alleluia. Hosanna comes from Hebrew meaning "save, we pray." In Greek, the word means "appeal to God for deliverance, used in praise of God or Christ." Alleluia means "praise the Lord!" There are so many things that we need saving from in our world. What do you need Jesus to save you from? When we call on Jesus to save us, we know that we live in a world that is far from perfect, and we need Jesus and the Holy Spirit's help.

 Draw a cross on your brick, to remind you of your ask. May these many crosses remind you to look towards Holy Week and what it means; that Christ conquered sin, death, and the devil.

Love Altered (Maundy Thursday)

On this night, we remember Jesus' servant-hearted love. We recall the life stories of how that kind of love has transformed hearts and lives. We pray that God's redeeming, radical love may alter our hearts for God's glory. Jesus loved those who hurt him. Jesus forgave them. Jesus loves you and forgives you.

- * I would like to conclude this time by inviting you into a time of prayer:
- * To lift up to God thanks for His radical love shown to you.
- * To ask God to make His love for you known.
- * To give thanks for those who were brought into your life to show you what forgiveness looks like.
- * Then, you are invited to write the first name of those who have shown God's abiding love to you on a brick. And to place that brick on our mosaic cross.

Life Altered (Easter)

At our two Easter services, we completed our Altered Mosaic Cross in the promise of the resurrection.

* Draw on one side the Jesus Fish. Write the first name of a person who shared the resurrection story with you. Prayerfully discern someone whom the Spirit has brought into your life who needs to hear the Easter promise from you and write their initials. Place the brick on the cross as you return to your seat.

How has your faith been *altered* lately? For almost two months, we as a community of faith have wrestled with where the Spirit is leading us and we continue to do so as we are led by the Spirit into new areas, meet new people, and engaged in new ministries.

I pray that you continue to witness the ways that the Holy Spirit is alive in, with, and under our ordinary lives. And may you see in new ways what the Spirit is already at work doing and the ways we are just trying to catch up.

We are in the season of Easter. Our first readings on the upcoming Sundays are from the Book of Acts. In the Book of Acts we get a good look at the community of Jesus' followers that is forming. They care for each and show it by sharing all that they have with each other.

I am full of gratitude to God for my call to Malawi.

The new year has brought with it an office in the business district making it available to clients. We continue to reach out to villagers with Cholera products and hygiene education.

Education on permaculture gardening is encouraged through classes and financial assistance. A variety of fruit trees are of benefit in developing a permaculture garden. The cost of a fruit tree is about \$10.00. There are currently 52 families in urgent need of our assistance. Their situation is considered catastrophic. Our Lenten Outreach this year is to work toward eliminating malnutrition by growing nutritious produce. Thank you all who supported us to reach and surpass our goal. We were generously blessed by our friends and congregation with a total of over \$7,300.

Thank you again, for your many years of love, prayers and support. Our achievements are numerous! We give thanks to Eva Banda and the board of directors for your constant leadership in developing the Centre for Girls and Women Empowerment, an NGO registered also with Congoma as they move forward assisting the poorest of the poor.



What is a Tiny Home of Barron County?

Tiny Homes are built for unsheltered individuals or families who are in need of temporary housing. They provide a safe place to live while the individual/family gain financial stability, make connections to resources and look for permanent housing. These Tiny Homes are equipped with a sleeping area, a chemical toilet, and kitchenette that includes a microwave and mini refrigerator.

As a church, we would provide the space and electricity for the Tiny Home and provide support to the individual/family living there by inviting them to worship, to our Wednesday community meals and by periodically checking in with them!

The Barron County Tiny Homes are not for anyone that is found to be homeless right

off the street, but for those that have been vetted by the county and that are gainfully employed already. These people have worked hard to qualify for this type of housing!

The Tiny Home committee is working to finalize plans with Barron County for delivery of the Tiny Home sometime in the spring. Please feel free to contact the church office with any questions you may have.



Explanation for the above chart:


- Column 1 is the actual quarter 1 donations and expenses. Several large annual expenses are paid in the first quarter, leading to a large negative net total.

We are able to provide the ministries we have at FLC in large part thanks to the efforts of our amazing staff and team of dedicated volunteers. Because staff enable programming to happen by equipping volunteers, here is a pie chart of our total ministry expenses to help us understand the true cost of what it takes for our ministries to happen. For simplicity in calculations, Pastor Ron's salary is distributed evenly over all the ministry areas. Some expenses are paid in lump sums but allocated quarterly for reporting purposes.
